Entries deal with concepts, such as formalism, multiculturalism, and the picture plane; some discuss specific movements such as Abstract Expressionism and Fluxus; some describe various ways of making art, such as collage, performance, and video. Together they provide an invaluable key to the specialized, often baffling vocabulary so often used in today's art world. Complementing the entries are two additional noteworthy features. The first, a one-page ArtChart, presents the history of the postwar years in a concise format that makes their chronological connections immediately visible. The second, an eight-page timeline - illustrated with full-color reproductions of paintings, sculptures, and installations - that charts major events in the art world and the world at large, providing a context for the entries that follow, in addition, for this revised edition, birth and death dates for the artists have been added to the index, along with their nationalities. An easy-to-use reference even more informative.

The Politics of Aesthetics Dec 26 2019 The Politics of Aesthetics rethinks the relationship between art and politics, reclaiming "aesthetics" from the narrow confines it is often reduced to.
